

In 2025, AIA Kansas City recognized design achievements by its Member Firms at the annual Design Excellence Awards. This year's jury Brad Cloepfil, AIA, Heidi Beebe, AIA, and Chris Brown, AIA, all of Portland reviewed a competitive field of 105 submissions and selected 21 projects for awards. # Committees & Programs




## ADVOCACY

The Advocacy Committee hosted its 6th annual City Hall Day in the fall, engaging 12 elected officials in 3 municipalities in both Kansas and Missouri to discuss key issues and advance the profession's interests.



## ARE SUCCESS TEAM

This is the 12th year of this program. These teams are supportive small groups of Associates who commit to taking all sections of the ARE in 12 months. The 2025 team had 10 participants and held 10 study sessions.



## COMMITTEE ON THE ENVIRONMENT

COTE IS BACK! This committee relaunched in Kansas City in 2025, hosting events on Mission 2030, Kansas City, Missouri's Energy Codes, and a special launch event in November with speaker, Dan Rockhill.



## DESIGN EXCELLENCE AWARDS

The Awards Committee put on a highly attended awards event, awarding 21 projects in October. In addition, they helped coordinate a juror lecture with UMKC and a "How To" submission session. This event offered tips on making projects stand out to the jury and featured information on the Common App.

## EDUCATION OUTREACH

This group participated in Design Career Days, Future Stages, KU Gear Up STEAM Fest, and other school visits. Additionally, this committee planned student design information nights, school visits, and Architecture Week Proclamations with four municipalities in conjunction with AIA National's Architecture Week.



## EQUITY IN ARCHITECTURE

Equity in Architecture hosted a series of engaging events this year, including committee meetings and panel discussions titled "Work Visa Future Diversity" and "The Rise and Fall of DEI". The committee continued to refine its vision and shape its future direction.

## PIERS MENTORING PROGRAM

This cross-generational program uses a team approach to connect members to create impactful and lasting relationships. This year there were 67 participants making up 9 groups and coordinating 36 mentoring events.



## PILLARS LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Pillars graduated 16 emerging leaders in 2025. Additionally, 16 participants were selected for the 20th class for the 2025-2026 Pillars session. To date, the program has proudly graduated a total of 292 participants, continuing to foster the development of future leaders.



## WOMEN IN DESIGN

WiD celebrated 20 years in 2025 with an anniversary event celebrating the past, present, and future of the committee. It also continued to offer mentorship to students interested in design through the 17th annual Day of Shadowing event. They also hosted two beginner's golf workshops and co-hosted the Trolley Tour with CREW KC.



## YOUNG ARCHITECTS FORUM

YAF hosted several programs to engage and support our early-career members, including 6 happy hours and a hands-on workshop with the ironworkers. Additionally, they designed, assembled, and delivered over 60 New Grad care packages.

# Additional Initiatives

## CENTER FOR ARCHITECTURE & DESIGN

- Hosted KC Design Week 2025. The 9-day event featured 25 events with 1,176 registrations.
- Coordinated multiple programs including an intern scavenger hunt, presentation prep workshop, and Trivingo.
- Hosted an Executive Summit with leadership from all of the CfAD's organizations.
- CfAD planned Design Careers Day in conjunction with KC STEM Alliance and ASCE Kansas City. This event is aimed at high school students, and provides insights into design careers.

## KANSAS CITY ARCHITECTURAL FOUNDATION

- Since 1991, Kansas City Architectural Foundation has given 250 scholarships totalling \$659,350 to 162 unique individuals.
- In 2025, 15 scholarships were awarded, totaling \$52,000. Scholarship amounts ranged from \$1,000 to \$8,000.
- 10 AIA Kansas City members serve on KCAF's Board of Directors.
- Additionally, 14 individuals and Member Firms and 15 Fellows made contributions to scholarships in 2025.
