The **Clarence Kivett Scholarship** was established in 2012. In 1945, Kivett started the firm of Kivett and Myers, Architects and Planners with Ralph Myers. Kivett and Myers was a well-known architecture firm in Kansas City designing notable projects such as the Kansas City International Airport, Truman Sports Complex and the Biological Sciences Building at the University of Missouri–Kansas City.

The **Fellows Scholarship** was established in 2021. The College of Fellows is the most prestigious level of membership in AIA. Members of this group are elevated because of everything they have given back to the profession and the community. Keeping with that focus, the Fellows from AIA Kansas City started a scholarship to recognize students with outstanding academics and need.

Peggy and Frank Zilm and Sprecklemeyer Scholarship established two scholarships to honor young and deserving architectural students the first named The Peggy and Frank Zilm Scholarship' and the second to honor Kent Spreckelmeyer a professor at the University of Kansas for his strong commitment to mentoring students named as The Kent Spreckelmeyer Scholarship'. These scholarships were established to award to deserving students attending the University of Kansas.

The **Daw/Jarvis/Goodman Scholarship** was created in memory of three Kansas City architects to continue on their legacy and love of design. Friends and family made contributions to the Kansas City Architectural Foundation to start a fund in their name.

The **DLR Group Scholarship** was first awarded in 2019. This scholarship is presented annually to an outstanding student who promises to be a leader in their future career.

AIA Kansas City is a firm supporter of students pursuing a degree in architecture. Since starting the **AIA Kansas City Grant** in 2006, they have awarded more than \$47,000 in scholarships.

The **Women in Design Scholarship** was established in 2011 by the Women in Design – Kansas City organization. This scholarship was established to help support women seeking degrees in design professions from Kansas and Missouri.
